# The Millennium

There are several different views Christians hold regarding the millennium. Many believe that during the millennium this earth will enjoy a time of peace, when people will live in a world where there is no blood shed, stealing, ly ing, etc., and where Christ Himself will be the visible King on the earth. Others be lieve that during the thou sand years there will not be any one alive upon this earth and God's people will be in heaven.

There are also several different views about the events that lead up to the millennium. Many believe there will be a seven-year period of persecution just prior to the millennium. Some of these Christians believe that all Chris tians will be secretly raptured out of the world at the beginning of this seven-year period, while others believe that Christians will be secretly raptured in the mid dle of this seven-year period. There are still others who believe that Christians will be raptured at the *end* of this seven-year period—not secretly, but openly for every eye to see.

With so many different ideas about the millen nium how can we know for sure which one is true? We need only to look at the plain Bi ble ev i dence to find the answer. The pur pose of this article is to ex am ine what the Bi ble says about these sub jects. The word "millennium" is used in reference to a time period of one thousand years. This word is not found in the Bi ble; how ever the Bi ble does use the term "thousand years" in nine separate verses. They are as follows: Psalm 90:4; Ecclesiastes 6:6; 2 Peter 3:8; & Revelation 20:2-7. The first three verses have nothing to do with an actual time period that will occur. The only place in the en tire Bi ble where we can find ref erence to a thousand year time period that will actually occur is in Revelation chapter twenty.

If we wish to find out what events take place just prior to the mil len nium, during the mil len nium, and at the close of the mil len nium, we must look at the twen tieth chapter of Reve la tion. This truly is the only place where we can come to a Bib li cal un der standing of this mil len nium. There are other verses in the Bi ble that describe events that will occur during, just prior to, and after the millennium, but none of these verses lay out the consecutive events sur rounding the millennium as

well as Reve la tion chap ter twenty. Let us look at this chap ter and find out for sure what the Bi ble says about the millen nium.

Verses 1-3 read as follows: "And I saw an angel come down from heaven, having the key of the bot tomless pit and a great chain in his hand. And he laid hold on the dragon, that old ser pent, which is the Devil, and Sa tan, and bound him a thou sand years, And cast him into the bot tom less pit, and shut him up, and set a seal upon him, that he should de ceive the na tions no more. till the thousand years should be fulfilled: and after that he must be loosed a little season." (Revelation 20:1-3) It is quite unlikely that these verses refer to a literal chain for a couple of reasons. As we all know, the book of Revelation uses more symbols than any other book in the Bi ble. Also, it is not pos si ble to use a lit eral chain to bind a spir i tual being who is capa ble of walk ing through walls. For these rea sons, and the context, I understand this chain to refer to a chain of circumstances binding Satan for a thousand years, keeping him from de ceiving any one.

Notice that these verses demonstrate that during the thou sand years Sa tan is not able to deceive any one, but af ter the thou sand years are over he will be able to deceive people again for a short time. Keep this in mind as we ex am ine the re maining verses.

Verse 4 reads: "And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Je sus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had re ceived his mark upon their fore heads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years." This verse is ob viously refer ring to righteous people. It says very clearly that they will live during the thou sand year pe riod. It also states that judgment was given unto them. What type of judg ment?

# Judgment of the wicked

Paul wrote, "Do ye not know that the saints shall judge the world? and if the world shall be judged by you, are ye un wor thy to judge the small est mat ters? Know ye not that we shall judge angels? how much more things that per tain to this life?" (1 Co rin thi ans 6:2, 3) Paul tells us that the saints will judge the world and the evil an gels. It is ob vi ous that the saints will not judge the righ teous, for the righ teous will al ready have been judged by the time the Lord co mes to take His chil dren to heaven. Dur ing the thou sand years the righ teous will be alive, judg ing the wicked and the fallen an gels.

John con tin ues, "But the rest of the dead lived not again un til the thou sand years were fin ished...." (Revelation 20:5) The phrase, "the rest of the dead" obviously refers to the wicked, for the righ teous are said to be alive during this time. During the thou sand years the righ teous will be alive, but the wicked will not be living. Let me take a mo ment to clarify here. Ac cording to the Bi ble "the dead know not any thing." (Ecclesiastes 9:5) They are completely un conscious of the things going on around them. (Please refer to the July, 1998 issue of Present Truth entitled "What the Bible says about Hell"—avail able by contacting the address at the end of this paper—for a thorough Bible study on this subject.)

#### Two resurrections

John continues, "... This is the first resurrection. Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first res urrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thou sand years." (Revelation 20:5,6) Ac cording to the Bible there will be two resurrections. Paul said, "there shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust." (Acts 24:15) And Jesus said, "Mar vel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, And shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." (John 5:28, 29)

In Rev e la tion 20:5, 6 God informs us that the first resurrection will be the resurrection of the righteous, for these are said to be "blessed and holy." It is also clear from these verses that the res ur rec tion of the righteous takes place before the thousand years, for those who have part in it will live and reign with Christ during this time, and that the res ur rec tion of the righ teous marks the be gin ning of the millen nium. Let us pin point ex actly when the res ur rec tion of the righ teous will take place.

"For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the arch an gel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up to gether with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord."

(1 Thessalonians 4:16, 17) At the second coming of Christ those who have died in Christ will rise first—this is the first res ur rec tion—then we which are alive and remain will be caught up with them in the clouds to be with the Lord.



Let us quickly sum ma rize what we have learned so far. When Christ returns all those who have died in Christ will be raised from the dead commencing the thou sand year mil len nium. During the mil len nium the righ teous will be liv ing and reign ing with Christ. They will be given judgment to judge the wicked and the fallen angels during this time. All the wicked will be dead during the mil len nium and Sa tan will be bound; un able to de ceive any one. At the end of the mil len nium the wicked will be res ur rected from the dead. (See Revelation 20:5.) At this time Sa tan will be loosed for a little sea son.

Isaiah wrote concerning the wicked, "And they shall be gath ered to gether, as pris on ers are gath ered in the pit, and shall be shut up in the prison, and after many days shall they be visited." (Isaiah 24:21, 22) Dur ing the thou sand years Sa tan will be un able to deceive any one, but af ter the wicked are raised from the dead he is loosed to deceive peo ple again. Who will he deceive? Ob vi ously not the righ teous for they are eternally secure, having already obtained immortality at Christ's sec ond coming. (See 1 Corin thi ans 15:51-53.) Satan will deceive the wicked who have just been raised from the dead.

Be fore we look at the rest of the events that will occur after the millen nium we need to look at a few verses about the New Jerusalem which will help us understand these events.

#### The New Jerusalem

John wrote, "And he car ried me away in the spirit to a great and high mountain, and shewed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God." (Revelation 21:10) John saw the New Jerusalem descend from God to the earth. Who was in the city? John wrote, "Blessed are they that do his command ments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may en ter in through the gates into the city. For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and murderers, and idolaters, and whosoever loveth and maketh a lie." (Revelation 22:14, 15) Only the righ teous will be allowed to enter into the city, but there will be some who must remain outside. John wrote con cern ing them: "But the fear ful, and un be lieving, and the abominable, and mur derers. and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all li ars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death." (Revelation 21:8) Here we see that those who cannot

en ter the city due to their sin ful ness, will suf fer the second death.

Con tinuing with Reve lation 20, John wrote, "And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, And shall go out to de ceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog [land of the wicked, see Ezekiel 38:1-3], to gather them to gether to bat tle: the num ber of whom is as the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the be loved city: and fire came down from God out of heaven, and de voured them." (Revelation 20:7)

Satan will con vince the wicked that they can take the beloved city, the New Jerusalem. They will surround the city in a vain at tempt to over throw it, but God will over rule and send fire down to de vour them.

Zech a riah re corded a sim i lar ac count of this event. Referring to the Lord he wrote, "And his feet shall stand in that day upon the mount of Ol ives, which is before Jerusalem on the east, and the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof to ward the east and toward the west, and there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it to ward the south. And ye shall flee to the valley of the mountains; for the valley of the moun tains shall reach unto Azal: yea, ye shall flee, like as ye fled from before the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah: and the LORD my God shall come, and all the saints with thee.... And the LORD shall be king over all the earth: in that day shall there be one LORD, and his name one." (Zechariah 14:4, 5, 9)

Here Zechariah saw the Lord descending on the Mount of Ol ives, and it di vided in two and spread out to make a great valley. Then he saw the Lord come with *all* His saints. Please no tice that this can not be refer ring to the sec ond com ing of Christ, for at that time the dead in Christ will rise from the dead and the righteous liv ing will be caught up with them in the air. *All* the saints cannot possibly be with the Lord untilafter they are raised from the dead and re deemed from this earth. Therefore this must have reference to another coming of our Lord. This is when the New Jerusalem descends from God out of heaven. The mount of Olives, spread ing out to make a great valley, is the pre paring of a place for the New Jerusalem. This does not occur until after the millen nium.



We already learned from the Bible what occurs next: the wicked are raised from the dead and they surround the city attempting to overthrow it. Then the Lord rains down fire from heaven that devours the wicked. Zechariah goes on to describe this scene. He wrote, "And this shall be the plague wherewith the LORD will smite all the peo ple that have fought against Je ru sa lem; Their flesh shall con sume away while they stand upon their feet, and their eyes shall consume away in their holes, and their tongue shall consume away in their mouth." (Zech a riah 14:12)

#### The destruction of the wicked

When the Bi ble speaks of the sec ond death and fire de vour ing the wicked, is it re fer ring to a con tin ual fire that tortures the wicked for billions and billions of years with no end? Please take a mo ment to con sider a few thoughts be fore we continue.

Suppose a fifteen-year-old boy gets drunk one night, steals his fa ther's car and wrecks it. If the fa ther of that boy would tor ment him with fire for one week we would say that man is cruel. Sup pose the fa ther tormented him for one year. Surely we would say this punishment is far too severe for the acts committed. Now sup pose the same young boy did the same thing but, in stead of living through it, he died in the acci dent. Do you sup pose God will take that young boy and torment him for bil lions and bil lions of years? This would be down right cruel—more cruel than the worst crim inal who has ever lived—not to men tion it is completely con trary to Scrip ture.

Is it fair to tor ture some one for mil lions of years for sins that may have taken only fif teen years to com mit? This surely sounds un fair to me. With this per cep tion of God we see Him as un fair and ac cord ingly, we feel jus ti fied in be ing un fair as well. The Scrip ture tells us that God is just and merciful and He treats us better than we de serve.

"Know therefore that God exacteth of thee less than thine in iquity deserveth." (Job 11:6) God gives us less than our in iqui ties de serve. This surely would not be the case if God would tor ture the wicked for bil lions of years.

The pun ish ment of the wicked will be ac cord ing to the things done during their life time. Je sus said, "And that ser vant, which knew his lord's will, and pre pared not him self, nei ther did ac cord ing to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes. But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have com mit ted much, of him they will ask the more." (Luke 12:47-48) Some will receive a punishment of longer duration than others, but none will be punished more se verely than they de serve. The prophet Obadiah wrote con cern ing the wicked: "... they shall be as though they had not been." (Obadiah 1:16) Da vid wrote, "For yet a lit tle while, and the wicked shall not be: yea, thou shalt dil i gently con sider his place, and it shall not be.... But the wicked shall perish, and the enemies of the LORD shall be as the fat of lambs: they shall consume; into smoke shall they con sume away." (Psalms 37:10, 20)

The idea that God takes pleasure in watching the wicked burn continually is a false teaching that has caused many peo ple to look upon God as an unkind tyrant—even worse than Hitler. This false doctrine has its or i gin with Sa tan who first said, "Ye shall not surely die." Man does not naturally have an im mor tal soul for he never ate of the tree of life after sinning, which would have allowed him to have eter nal life in a sin ful state.

We are be coming like the God whom we be hold. If we are be hold ing a God who is pleased to see the creatures whom He has made suffer with out end, then we will ac quire the same type of char ac ter. But this is far from the true character of God, for the Bible clearly states, "As I live, saith the Lord GOD, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live: turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die, O house of Is rael?" (Ezekiel 33:11) Truly God is merciful and kind, even in his deal ings with those who finally reject Him. We have seen quite clearly the events that mark the beginning of the Millennium, the end of the Millennium, and some facts about what happens during the Millennium. Yet there are a few de tails we have not examined.

# **During the millennium**

Among Christians there are several ideas about what will happen during the millennium. The Bible makes it clear that all the wicked will be dead during the millennium. It is evident that they will be on this earth during that time for their res ur rection from their graves will not have occurred yet, and their graves are on this earth. What about the right eous; where are they during the millennium? The Bi ble tells us that they are



with Christ. Does the Bi ble tell us where Christ is during this time?

In Paul's ac count of the sec ond coming of Christ he does not in dicate that He ever sets foot upon this earth. He wrote, "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and re main shall be caught up to gether with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." (1 Thessalonians 4:16, 17) At the second coming of Christ the righ teous will be caught up in the air to meet the Lord and be with him there.

There are sev eral rea sons why I do not be lieve that Christ and the righ teous will be on this earth during the thou sand years.

- 1) There is no record in the Bible stating that Christ or His people will be on this earth during the millennium.
- 2) Just prior to the second coming of Christ there will be a great earth quake causing every is land to flee away and every mountain to be cast down. "And there were voices, and thunders, and lightnings; and there was a great earthquake, such as was not since men were upon the earth, so mighty an earth quake, and so great.... And every is land fled away, and the mountains were not found." (Revelation 16:18-20)
- 3) The landscape of the earth will be in a very cha otic con di tion during this time. "Be hold, the LORD maketh the earth empty, and maketh it waste, and turneth it upside down, and scattereth abroad the inhab it ants thereof.... The land shall be ut terly emp tied, and utterly spoiled: for the LORD hath spoken this word.... The earth also is de filed un der the in hab it ants thereof; because they have transgressed the laws, changed the ordinance, broken the everlasting covenant." (Isaiah 24:1-5) Isaiah continued, "... the foun dations of the earth do shake. The earth is ut terly bro ken down, the earth is clean dissolved, the earth is moved exceedingly. The earth shall reel to and fro like a drunk ard, and shall be re moved like a cot tage; and the transgression thereof shall be heavy upon it; and it shall fall, and not rise again." (Isa iah 24:18-20)
- 4) The surface of the earth will be littered with many dead bodies during this time. "For, be hold, the LORD cometh out of his place to pun ish the in hab it ants of the earth for their in iq uity: the earth also shall disclose her blood, and shall no more cover her slain." (Isaiah 26:21)

- 5) The Bible describes a time when there are no in hab it ants on this earth. "I have cut off the na tions: their towers are desolate; I made their streets waste, that none passeth by: their cit ies are de stroyed, so that there is no man, that there is none in hab it ant.... Therefore wait ye upon me, saith the LORD, un til the day that I rise up to the prey: for my de ter mi na tion is to gather the na tions, that I may as sem ble the king doms, to pour upon them mine in dig na tion, even all my fierce an ger: for all the earth shall be devoured with the fire of my jealousy." (Zephaniah 3:6-8)
- 6) This old earth is said to be destroyed by fire, af ter which there will be a new heaven and a new earth. "Looking for and hasting unto the com ing of the day of God, wherein the heav ens be ing on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat? Never the less we, ac cord ing to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness." (2 Pe ter 3:12, 13)
- 7) The new earth will not be in existence until after the thousand years are completed. (See Revelation 21.)

This is very conclusive evidence that Christ and His right eous people will not be on this earth during the millennium. So where will they be? We are told that they will live and reign with Christ and that judgment will be given to them. This ev i dently will be in heaven in the city which God has pre pared for His people, for the New Jerusalem is said to have come down from heaven after the thou sand years.

The bib li cal ev i dence is clear that during the thousand years the right eous will be in heaven with Christ, and the wicked will be dead in their graves awaiting their res ur rection at the end of the millen nium.

## What about the secret rapture?

Many Christians honestly believe that Christ will re turn se cretly to rap ture His peo ple prior to the great trib u lation which oc curs just be fore the mil len nium. If this is true, there is no need to pre pare for such a trib ulation. If this is not true, many will be caught in the tribulation without making the necessary preparations. Paul wrote con cern ing this time; "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sud den de struction com eth upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape." (1 Thessalonians 5:3) As you can see, it is very important to understand the truth about this sub ject. Let us take a few min utes to ex amine what the Bi ble says about it.



A few well-known verses used to sup port the idea of a secret rapture are found in Matthew 24. "Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two women shall be grind ing at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left." (Mat thew 24:40, 41) Many as sume that those who are taken are the righteous being secretly raptured, leaving the wicked to won der what had hap pened to those missing. How ever, if one would just read the preceding three verses it would be very clear what is spoken of here. Here are the verses in their con text:

"But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eat ing and drink ing, mar rying and giv ing in mar riage, un til the day that Noe entered into the ark, And knew not un til the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left." (Mat thew 24:37-41)

Je sus made a par al lel here and said that it would be the same when Christ returns as it was in the days of Noah. In the days of Noah those who were taken were the wicked, taken in death by the flood. So shall it be when the Lord re turns. Those who will be taken will be the wicked who are taken in death at the bright ness of the Lord's return. Let us look at a few other verses which men tion the same event.

When the Lord re turns there will be two classes of people upon this earth, one of which will cry out, "...this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us." (Isaiah 25:9) The other class of people will "hid[e] themselves in the dens and in the rocks of the mountains," and say "to the moun tains and rocks, Fall on us, and hide us from the face of him that sitteth on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb." (Revelation 6:15, 16) Regarding the coming of the Lord, Malachi wrote, "But who may abide the day of his com ing? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap." (Malachi 3:2) John wrote, "For the great day of his wrath is come: and who shall be able to stand?" (Reve la tion 6:17) The ob vi ous an swer to who will be able to stand is the righ teous—those who have pre pared themselves to meet the Lord.

Paul wrote about the destruction of the Antichrist power in this way; "And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall con sume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall de stroy with the bright ness of his coming." (2 Thessalonians 2:8) When the Lord returns, only the righteous will be able to stand the "brightness of his coming." Isaiah wrote concerning the coming of the Lord: "There fore hath the curse devoured the earth, and they that dwell therein are desolate: there fore the in hab it ants of the earth are burned, and few men left." (Isa iah 24:6) Who will be left? Certainly! It will be the righ teous.

#### **Answering some objections**

There are some who believe in the secret rapture who like to quote Christ's words to the church of Phil adel phia as proof of this the ory. Christ said, "Because thou hast kept the word of my pa tience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth." (Revelation 3:10) Please no tice that this is spoken to one of the seven churches. It is not the last of the seven, for one more church comes after it. If the churches are in chronological order as many believe, then this could not be referring to the great tribulation.

Also, how does God keep peo ple from evil that comes upon the earth? "The righ teous perisheth, and no man layeth it to heart: and merciful men are taken away, none considering that the righteous is taken away from the evil to come." (Isaiah 57:1) As we can see, God will keep some of His people from going through the great tribulation, not by se cretly rapturing them out of the world, but by allowing them to die before this hour comes.

The Bible demonstrates that there will be a great tribulation just prior to the sec ond coming of Christ for which we must pre pare. Amos wrote, "pre pare to meet thy God." (Amos 4:12) We have been warned of those who cry out "peace and safety." Paul wrote, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sud den de struction com eth upon them, as tra vail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape." (1 Thessalonians 5:3)

"And Jesus answered and said unto them, Take heed that no man de ceive you. For many shall come in my name, say ing, I am Christ; and shall de ceive many. And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not trou bled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places. All these are the be gin ning of sorrows." (Mat thew 24:4-8)



Jesus described the condition of the world in the last days. Right after doing this would have been the perfect opportunity for Jesus to tell his disciples that they would then be raptured but notice what He said next: "Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. And then shall many be of fended, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another. And many false proph ets shall rise, and shall deceive many. And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved." (Matthew 24:9-13)

Jesus said that if we en dure to the end we will be saved. Friends, there are events that will come upon this earth which we must en dure be fore the end co mes. Please take every opportunity given you to make the necessary prep a ra tions to meet the Lord when He comes.

#### Preparing to meet the Lord

We know we must prepare to meet the Lord, but what prep a rations are necessary for us to be ready for that day? The Bi ble speaks of two groups of people in the last days—those who receive the mark of the beast and those who receive the seal of God. We read concern ing the seal of God:

"And after these things I saw four an gels stand ing on the four cor ners of the earth, hold ing the four winds of the earth, that the wind should not blow on the earth, nor on the sea, nor on any tree. And I saw an other angel as cend ing from the east, hav ing the seal of the living God: and he cried with a loud voice to the four an gels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, Say ing, Hurt not the earth, nei ther the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their fore heads. And I heard the num ber of them which were sealed: and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thou sand of all the tribes of the chil dren of Is rael." (Revelation 7:1-4)

John wrote con cerning those who re ceive the seal of God: "And I looked, and, lo, a Lamb stood on the mount Sion, and with Him an hun dred forty and four thousand, having His Father's name written in their foreheads.... And in their mouth was found no guile: for they are without fault before the throne of God." (Revelation 14:1,5)

Just prior to the coming of our Lord in the clouds of heaven, there will be a group of people that have the Father's name (character) written in their foreheads.

They will reflect the character of God in their lives. These will receive the seal of God rather than the mark of the beast. The Bi ble tells us that this group of peo ple will be with out fault be fore God. They will not sin nor teach false hoods, for "The rem nant of Is rael shall not do iniquity, nor speak lies; neither shall a deceitful tongue be found in their mouth: for they shall feed and lie down, and none shall make them afraid." (Zephaniah 3:13)

This group of people are prepared to meet their God. When the Lord co mes they will say, "this is our God; we have waited for Him, and He will save us." (Isaiah 25:9) The proclamation in Revelation 22:11 will have al ready been given. "He that is un just, let him be un just still: and he which is filthy, let him be filthy still: and he that is right eous, let him be right eous still: and he that is holy, let him be holy still." (Revelation 22:11) Each per son's case will have been set tled at this point, whether for eter nal life or for de struction.

One group of people will have overcome sin, for Jesus said, "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also over came, and am set down with my Father in His throne." (Revelation 3:21) Another group of people will have chosen to cling to their sins and they will be destroyed at the brightness of His coming. "Behold, the day of the LORD com eth, cruel both with wrath and fierce an ger, to lay the land des o late: and He shall de stroy the sinners thereof out of it." (Isaiah 13:9) According to the Bible, if you are still sinning when the Lord returns, you will be de stroyed.

With this brief il lus tra tion of the ne ces sity of overcom ing sin be fore the Lord re turns, we can now look at some Bi ble prin ci ples of how to over come sin.

#### How to overcome sin

Paul wrote, "Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. There hath no temp tation taken you but such as is com mon to man: but God is faith ful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temp ta tion also make a way to es cape, that ye may be able to bear it." (1 Corin thi ans 10:12, 13) God knows how much temp ta tion we are able to bear and prom ises that He will never allow us to be tempted above what we can bear. He will al ways make a way of es cape.

Can Sa tan force us to sin? No. Sa tan can not force us to sin. We have to make the choice to yield our selves to Satan before we sin. Rather than yielding to Satan



we must learn to yield our selves to God and allow Him to give us the strength to over come temp ta tion.

What is temp ta tion? Let's look at a plain Bi ble definition of temptation. "But ev ery man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath con ceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death." (James 1:14, 15) Is it a sin to be tempted? No. It only be comes a sin when you allow verse 15 to take effect. To be tempted is to be drawn away of your own lust and enticed.

For ex ample, sup pose a man is walk ing through the checkout line in a grocery store. Inevitably there are several magazines in the racks that have half-naked women on the cover. The man glances around and notices one of these magazines. There is something in him that is drawn to continue looking at this picture, however he understands that it is wrong to continue look ing at the pic ture and im me di ately turns away. Realizing his own weak ness, and the dan ger he is in, he calls upon the Lord to de liver him from this temp ta tion. Immediately the Lord gives him the vic tory he so longs for and draws his mind to fo cus on eter nal things.

Was it a sin for the man to have glanced at the picture to be gin with (in this case we will say he did it innocently), and have some longing to continue looking at it? No. He was tempted by being drawn to do that which was wrong to do, but this temptation was not a sin. It would have be come a sin had he stared at the picture and/or allowed his mind to wonder and dwell on for bid denter ritory. This is "when lust hath con ceived, [and] it bringeth forth sin." (James 1:15)

Under standing how temptation works is neces sary for us in order to know how to over come when we are tempted. There are three basic responses that the man in the previous example could have had.

- 1) He could have stared at the picture and allowed his mind to wonder on forbidden territory this plainly be coming a sin. Je sus said, "But I say to you, that every one who is look ing on a woman to de sire her, did already commit adultery with her in his heart." (Matthew 5:28 Young's Literal Translation) It is not the look ing at a woman that is a sin, or even the drawing that a man has within him to ward a woman that is a sin, but when a man looks upon a woman for the purpose of lust ing after her, this is a sin.
- 2) He could have decided that it was wrong to continue look ing at the pic ture and chose to look away,

trying to force himself to think about something else, thus striv ing in his own strength.

3) He could have recognized the sin in continuing to look at the pic ture and im me di ately turned away. Re al izing his own weak ness and the dan ger he is in, he could have called upon the Lord to deliver him from this temptation.

Which of these re sponses would have been the correct re sponse? Ob vi ously num ber 3. When we are being tempted we must call upon the Lord and He will be right there to give us the help we so des per ately need. I can not over-emphasize the im por tance of call ing upon the Lord for strength immediately when we are being tempted.

#### Calling upon the Lord

Christ is well able to help us when we are tempted, "For in that He Himself hath suffered being tempted, He is able to succour" [to run to the cry of those in danger, to help—Thayer's Greek Lexicon] them that are tempted." (Hebrews 2:18) When we are being tempted we must call upon the Lord for deliverance, and He will come and help us. Je sus said, "I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you." (John 14:18) Jesus Himself has suffered being tempted, therefore He knows exactly how to help us when we are being tempted, and will come when we cry unto Him. For "greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world." (1 John 4:4)

"For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feel ing of our in fir mi ties; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet with out sin. Let us there fore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:15, 16) Christ was in all points tempted like as we are, yet with out sin. Therefore let us come boldly to the throne of God when we are being tempted and He will quickly come to our aid.

God said, "call upon me in the day of trou ble: I will de liver thee, and thou shalt glo rify me." (Psalm 50:15) "He shall call upon me, and I will an swer him: I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him, and honour him." (Psalm 91:15) David wrote, "Unless the LORD had been my help, my soul had al most dwelt in si lence. When I said, My foot slippeth; thy mercy, O LORD, held me up." (Psalm 94:17, 18) The Lord will help us when we are be ing tempted if we call upon Him and do not rely on our own strength. How can we ex pect to be victor i ous if we do not call upon the Lord? We are pow erless be fore Sa tan's at tacks with out God's help.



Paul admonished, "(For the weapons of our warfare are not car nal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) Cast ing down imag i nations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ." (2 Corinthians 10:4, 5) We do not fight against Satan's temptations with swords and spears. These are use less in our bat tle with sin. Our weap ons are mighty only through God. If we do not call upon Him when we are tempted we will not over come. It would be as point less as fac ing an entire army alone with a sword made of pa per.

#### Put on the armour of God

"Finally, my breth ren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might [not the power of your own might]. Put on the whole ar mour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wres tle not against flesh and blood, but against prin cipal i ties, against pow ers, against the rul ers of the darkness of this world, against spir i tual wick ed ness in high places. Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and hav ing done all, to stand. Stand there fore, hav ing your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breast plate of righteous ness." (Ephe sians 6:10-14)

Notice the first piece of armour we are to put on. Paul said we are to have to our "loins girt about with truth." Does this mean we are to put a belt on that has truth writ ten on it? No. We are to have our minds filled and sur rounded with truth. Je sus prayed to His Fa ther, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth." (John 17:17) Study the word of God so you know of a cer tainty the words of truth. "Have not I writ ten to thee excellent things in counsels and knowledge, That I might make thee know the certainty of the words of truth; that thou mightest answer the words of truth to them that send unto thee?" (Prov erbs 22:20, 21)

Ex am ine your self to see if you are call ing upon the Lord when you are tempted. When the Lord sees you call upon Him when you are being tempted, He sees that you do not want to yield to that sin and He will honor your cry and give you the vic tory. If you do not call upon Him when you are being tempted, the Lord can see that you still have some de sire to hang on to that sin. He will not give you the vic tory.

We need to de spise sin so much that we would be will ing to die rather than sin. Je sus had this ex pe ri ence, and He was put to death. He would not yield on any point to the temp ta tions of the Devil. Je sus "loved righ-

teousness, and hated iniquity." (Hebrews 1:9) We must have this same hatred for sin. Paul wrote, "Ye have not yet re sisted unto blood, striv ing against sin." (He brews 12:4) There will be a time when God's people will be required to resist unto blood in striving against sin. "For sin shall not have dominion over you." (Romans 6:14)

#### Sin is a choice

We are never forced to sin. Sin begins in our thoughts, therefore in our thoughts we must fight the battle immediately when temptation comes. We must choose to serve God with all our hearts. Joshua said, "choose you this day whom ye will serve." (Joshua 24:15) Paul wrote, "Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obe dience unto righteous ness?" (Romans 6:16)

Mo ses said, "I call heaven and earth to re cord this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, bless ing and curs ing: there fore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live." (Deuteronomy 30:19) God gives us the choice of whom we will serve, but He strongly en cour ages us to choose the good. God loves us so much that He wants each one of us to be saved. Pe ter wrote, "The Lord is... not will ing that any should per ish, but that all should come to re pen tance." (2 Peter 3:9)

### Make no provision for sin

There is another important thing to remember in our Christian walk. Peter wrote, "put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not pro vi sion for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof." (Romans 13:14) We are ad monished not to make any pro vi sion for the flesh. Do not do anything that would make it easy to fall into sin. Never go out of the way to put your self into a position that may cause you to fall into sin.

I heard of a man that used to be an alcoholic. He had given up drink ing for quite some time and had discarded all of his bot tles of al co hol; all ex cept one. He would carry this bot tle with him un der the seat of his car. One of his friends stum bled across it while look ing through his car one day. Shocked, his friend ques tioned him as to why he would have such a thing in his car. The man re plied, "I carry it around just in case I need it." This man had stopped drink ing for quite some time, but was not sure he re ally wanted to give it up for good.



Are we like this man when it comes to sin in our lives? Are we mak ing pro vi sion for the flesh to ful fill the lusts thereof?

I read of an army general who went out to fight a bat tle. Be fore he could face the en emy he had to march his army over a bridge spanning a deep chasm. After marching his army over the bridge, and going over him self, he burned the bridge be hind them, thus making any retreatimpossible. This gave the army the increased de sire to win the bat tle for they had no way of es cape. Thus the en emy was de feated.

Here is an other quick story: Sev eral men went out on an expedition to a far country. After arriving on shore in a strange country they burned the boat they had trav eled upon. If they would have any de sire to go back home, it would not be possible because the ship had been burnt up.

Are we burn ing the boats and bridges be hind us in our lives? Do we have some reserve about giving our lives to the Lord com pletely? God says to us now, "ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart." (Jere miah 29:13)

Paul wrote, "There fore, breth ren, we are debt ors, not to the flesh, to live after the flesh. For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mor tify the deeds of the body, ye shall live. For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." (Romans 8:12-14) Ev ery de ci sion we make for good or evil, we are ei ther stand ing for God or for the Devil. Let us follow after the Spirit that we may live. "This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh." (Galatians 5:16)

I pray that the Lord will guide you as you study His word and fol low Him. Again I must em pha size the importance of call ing upon the Lord when you are be ing tempted, and He will help you and deliver you out of your troubles.

# Who is Worthy of Worship?

"And if any man think that he knoweth any thing, he knoweth noth ing yet as he ought to know." (1 Co rin thians 8:2)

Our prayer is that as we each study the Bi ble we can rec og nize that we know noth ing "yet," as we ought to know it. We can always learn something more from each verse, as well as each topic, that we have ever studied.

The topic we will be gin to cover in this study is who is wor thy of wor ship? This can be done us ing a sim ple math equa tion of *one plus one*. We will see who was involved in cre ation, re demp tion, and the coun sel of the Fa ther and Son from eter nity. We will also ex pose Satan's plan to cause Chris tians to wor ship him!

#### Creation

God's right to receive worship from us is based upon the fact that He cre ated us. (See Ex o dus 20:8-11) The Bi ble tells us that two in di vid u als were in volved in cre ation. Paul wrote, "...God, who cre ated all things by **Je sus Christ**." (Ephesians 3:9) God the Father is one be ing and Je sus Christ is one be ing: one plus one is **two**. When the Bi ble says all things were cre ated by the Father and His Son, that means **all things**. Stated sim ply,

ev ery thing that was cre ated was cre ated by God and His Son, Je sus Christ.

"God... Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his **Son**, whom he hath ap pointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds." (He brews 1:1, 2) The fo cus is that it was only the Fa ther and the Son who created the worlds or uni verse. Again only the Fa ther and the Son: one plus one is two.

"Who hath as cended up into heaven, or de scended? who hath gathered the wind in his fists? who hath bound the waters in a gar ment? who hath es tab lished all the ends of the earth? what is his name, and what is his son's name, if thou canst tell?" (Proverbs 30:4) This verse is clearly talk ing of creation and can only apply to the Fa ther and the Son: one plus one equals two.

Speaking about before and during creation, Proverbs 8:24-30 shows that the Son was there and says He was "as one brought up with" the Father. In the Bible, there is no one else who can make that state ment ex cept the Son of God. So when the Fa ther was speak ing during creation it could have been only to His Son, for it was God who created all things by His Son. One plus one is two.

When God said, "Let there be light," to whom was He speak ing? Surely, it was to His only be got ten Son.



When God said, "Let us make man in our image," He was speak ing to none other than His Son, who formed man out of the dust of the ground. One plus one is two.

## Redemption

Regarding redemption, Jesus made it clear what eter nal life was. "And this is life eter nal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent." (John 17:3) We must know God! While many are say ing that God is a mys tery, our Lord Je sus said we must in ti mately know God and who He is. Jesus said we must know God, the Father, as the "only true God." Never did He say we must know any being other than the Father, the only true God, and His only-begotten Son. One plus one is still two.

The Bible teaches that there is ultimately one supreme God, the Fa ther. And that "...there is none other God but one. For though there be that are called gods, whether in heaven or in earth, (as there be gods many, and lords many,) *But to us there is but one God, the Father*, of whom are all things, and we in him; and *one Lord Je sus Christ*, by whom are all things, and we by him. Howbeit there is not in every man that knowledge:..." (1 Co rin thi ans 8:4-7)

Even Christ, though being God by virtue of His birth in heaven, is never referred to as the "most High God," the "An cient of days," the "liv ing God" or "God the Father." Christ always refers to His Father as greater than Him self. Christ is our Lord and wor thy of worship. However "there is not in every man this knowl edge" of the Fa ther and His Son. One plus one is two.

"Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowl edge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Je sus." (1 Tim o thy 2:4, 5) There is only One Being in the uni verse who will lead you to the Fa ther, and that is His Son. "Je sus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man com eth unto the Fa ther, but by me." (John 14:6) Jesus said that there is only one way to get to His Fa ther, not two ways or three ways.

# False Religion

False re li gion, which the Bi ble re fers to as Bab y lon, im plies that Je sus changed His mind later and added another being into the picture. (See verse 16) Jesus said "And I will pray the Fa ther, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him:

but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. I will not leave you com fort less: I will come to you." (John 14:16-18) Because of the pronouns "he" and "him," many are led to believe that there is "another" being other than the Father and His Son. Let's ex am ine the ev i dence of who the pro nouns re fer to.

First, this Comforter will abide with us forever. It was Jesus who said, "I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." (Mat thew 28:20)

Sec ond, Je sus said, "the spirit of truth." Just a few mo ments ear lier Je sus had said, "I am the truth." (John 14:6) So, the Spirit of Truth would be the Spirit of Jesus.

Third, the world doesn't know Him "but ye know him." Who is it that "knows" Him? His dis ci ples. Why would they know Him? Be cause He was dwell ing with them and would later be in them.

Fourth, He adds, "I will not leave you com fort less: I will come to you." We now have a Com forter who can be "touched with the feeling of our infirmities." (See Hebrews 4:15) "We have an advocate [comforter] ...Jesus Christ the righteous." (1 John 2:1) One who has experienced our humanity.

False re li gion of fers a com forter who has not ex perienced humanity, called God the Holy Spirit. He comes in the form of **a false** Holy Spirit which, in re al ity, is Satan himself. There is a true belief regarding the Spirit of God, but it would not make the Spirit out to be some one to sing to or wor ship. (See John 16:13.)

In eter nity past there was a coun sel that took place, concerning all creation, that was between the Father and His Son. "And the counsel of peace shall be between them both" (Zech a riah 6:13) There was an other being who thought he should be included. His name was Lucifer, later called Satan. He said, "I will be like the most High." (Read Isaiah 14:12-14.) When God said, "Let us make man in our im age and af ter our likeness," Lucifer became jealous. He cannot bring forth life; humanity can. He cannot sit on the Son of God's throne; victorious humanity will. (Revelation 3:21)

In reality, Satan cannot be equal with God or His Son. He does not de serve wor ship as do the Fa ther and His Son. Though we know this is true, many have never questioned what the trinity or triune concept of God means.

The word trin ity means that there are three in di vidu als, but there were only two in volved in the cre ation of all the universe, only two are involved in saving man and only two divine beings are mentioned in the de-



scrip tions of the new earth. (See Rev e la tion 21:22, 23; 22:1, 3.) The hon est ques tion is, **who is** this third en tity that God's pro fessed peo ple are speak ing to, sing ing to, and even bow ing down and pray ing to?

In the con cept of the trin ity, there are three en ti ties, "God the Father," "God the Son," "and God the Holy Spirit." It is taught that all three are equal, all three are the same age, all three took counsel together in creation, and in the re demption of man. Is n't it in ter est ing that Sa tan wanted to be equal with God, wanted to take counsel with Him, but could not? (Read Ezekiel 28:15-19 and Isa iah 14:12-15.)

Lis ten to what Sa tan him self said, "I will ex alt my throne above the stars of God: I will sit also upon the mount of the con gre ga tion, in the sides of the north: I will as cend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most High." Sa tan claimed that he would some day be wor shiped and be equal with God the Fa ther!

It may come as a sur prise to you that many are worship ing Sa tan in the false idea of God the Holy Spirit. Re member the Jew ish nation, how they wor shiped Baal in stead of the one true God and His Son. (1 Kings 18:21)

The Holy Spirit is es sen tial to our sal va tion, but it is the power and per sonal pres ence of the Fa ther and His Son. Simply, it is the Spirit of God and the Spirit of Christ. (Read Romans 8:9-11.) "God has sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father." (Galatians 4:6) The Spirit is the mind or per sonal pres ence and power of God and His Son. The Word is how they communicate that presence. Jesus said, "...the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." (John 6:63) When we are receiving the "Word," or "Spirit," God's mind is touch ing ours.

May the grace of God and the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you al ways in all that you do.
